Offers Opportunities with Horses and Helping Others

A new program designed to offer kids and adults more time with horses and a rewarding opportunity to help develop young equestrians was introduced at Chagrin Valley Farms earlier this year.

Equestrians will gain experience within the lesson program and/or the summer riding camp program while earning points to be used toward riding lessons, practice ride-time, show entry credits and merchandise. As they develop their skills supporting the equestrian program, they will also gain volunteer experience toward school service requirements and future resume building, in addition to camaraderie and social networking.

All are welcome to apply for the mentorship service program. "This is a great program for equestrians to gain experience helping beginners get started and enhance their horsemanship skills. Adults who used to ride and miss being at the barn can come back and enjoy being around horses once again. Volunteer work can be extremely rewarding and is seen as a positive trait by colleges, universities and employers," explained Cami Blanchard, Program Director for Chagrin Valley Farms.

For those looking to spend more time at the barn this summer, the Summer Camp Assistantships offer a great opportunity and a chance to help young riders build their skills during weeklong camp programs. New camp curriculum will include more guest speakers and opportunities to learn more about horse care and equestrian topics.

Mentorship participants will be assigned their working level based on experience and they will assist in appropriate level classes. They will be able to move up to the next level after ongoing assessments of skill and experience.
